

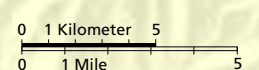
GREAT SMOKY MOUNTAINS NATIONAL PARK

Geographical Features: Cherokee National Forest, Pisgah National Forest, Nantahala National Forest, Joyce Kilmer-Slickrock Wilderness Area, Cherokee Indian Reservation (Qualla Boundary).

Mountains and Peaks: Sugarland Mountain, Elkmont, Clingmans Dome (6643ft / 2024m), Mount Le Conte (6593ft / 2009m), Chimney Tops, Thunderhead Mountain, Sillers Bald, Andrews Bald, High Rocks, Shuckstack, Fontana Dam, Stecoah Gap, Cheoah Bald, Wesser.

Water Features: Little Pigeon River, Middle Prong, Roaring Fork, Balsam River, Oconaluftee River, Soco Creek, Deep Creek, Hazel Creek, Fontana Lake, Lake Cheoah, Santeetlah Lake, Waterville Lake, Lake Chimney Tops.

Visitor Centers and Landmarks: Sugarlands Visitor Center, Elkmont, Oconaluftee Visitor Center, Cades Cove Visitor Center, Abrams Creek, Look Rock, Big Creek, Cosby, Cataloochee, Smokemont, Balsam Mountain, Deep Creek, Bryson City, Dillsboro, Wessiter.

Trails and Routes: Appalachian Trail, Foothills Parkway, Blue Ridge Parkway, Cherokee Skyway, Roaring Fork Motor Nature Trail (closed in winter), Rich Mountain Road (closed in winter), Balsam Mtn Rd (closed in winter), Heintzberger Ridge Road (closed in winter).
